## Abstract for talk to AEG Sacramento Section - Feb. 22, 2011

"Changes to the Underground Storage (UST) Tank Cleanup Fund"

This presentation is intended to provide an update on UST Cleanup Fund activities, in particular, implementation of the new business model that the Fund has adopted in response to an external audit. This audit was prompted by recent revenue and cash flow problems, and identified areas of program administration where improvements could be made.

In addition, there will be updates on the new School District Account, Orphan Site Cleanup Fund, and the federal American Recovery & Reinvestment Act ("ARRA") funds used for petroleum UST brown-fields.

**Background:** Federal and state laws require every owner and operator of a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) to maintain financial responsibility to pay for any damages arising from their tank operations.

The Barry Keene Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund Act of 1989 was created by the California Legislature, and is administered by the California State Water Resources Control Board, to provide a means for petroleum UST owners and operators to meet the federal and state requirements. The Fund also assists a large number of small businesses and individuals by providing reimbursement for unexpected and catastrophic expenses associated with the cleanup of leaking petroleum USTs.

In addition, the Fund also provides money to the Regional Water Quality Control Boards and local regulatory agencies to abate emergency situations or to cleanup abandoned sites that pose a threat to human health, safety, and the environment, as a result of a petroleum release from a UST.

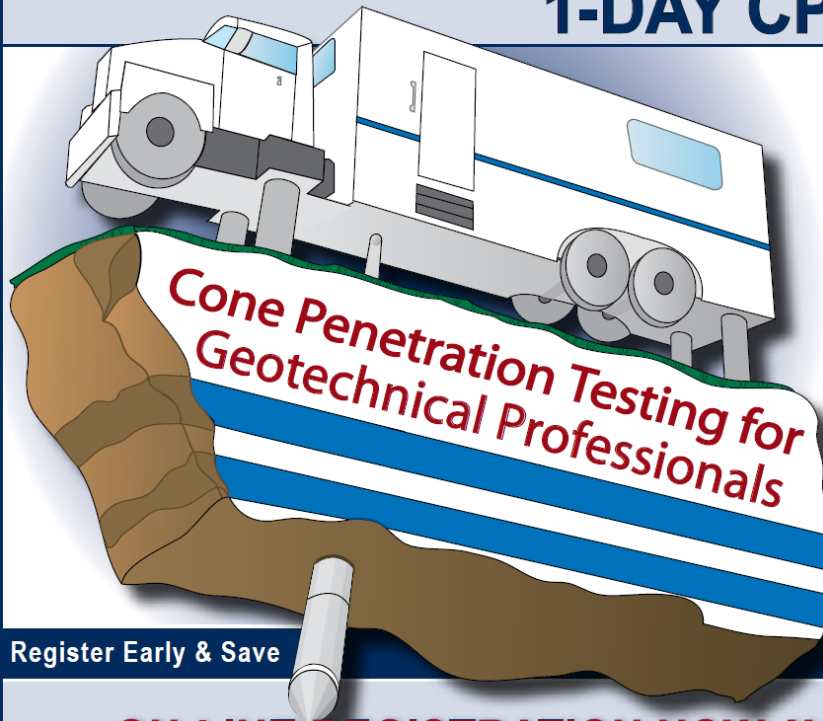

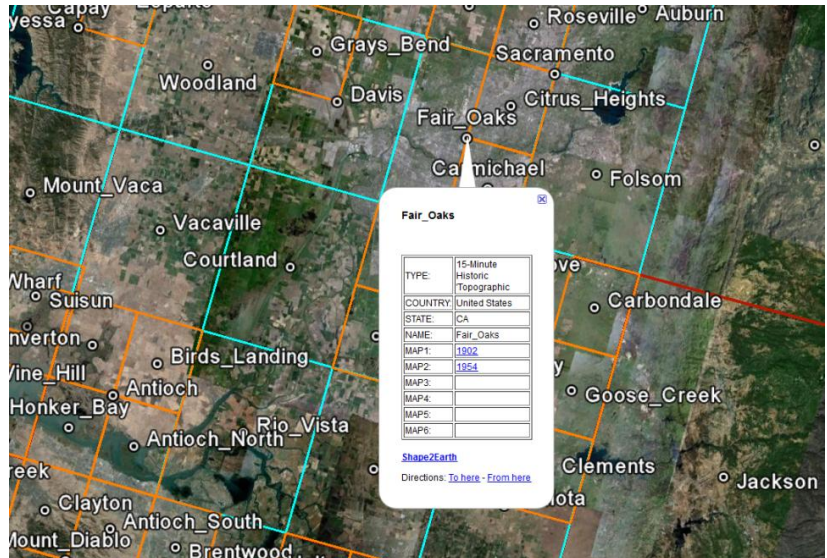

## NEW! Tips for the Tech-savvy Geologist

Google Earth (GE) Plug-Ins – USGS Topographic Maps and Historical Topographic Maps  
These are two really useful plug-ins for Google Earth.

The plug-in will load in your “Temporary Places” in GE, and will need to be dragged into your “My Places.” Otherwise, you will have to load the plug-in each time you want to use it. From there, just zoom into your area of interest until the 7.5-minute grid lines show and click on the map title that you want. The topo map will load in several seconds depending on your connection speed. Once loaded, you can use the transparency bar at the bottom of the Places sidebar to toggle back and forth between the map and photo base. The individual maps will then load in your “Temporary Places” and will be discarded when you close GE. For a frequently used topo, drag the topo file to your “My Places”.



Make sure to load the historical topo map plug-in which allows you to access an impressive number of historical topos!
